Assemblyman John Wisniewski

Assembly Transportation Committee Chairman John Wisniewski was first elected to the New Jersey Assembly in 1995 representing the 19th District of Middlesex County and currently serves as Deputy Speaker. Assemblyman Wisniewski was a prime sponsor of three major transportation initiatives: the "Fix DMV" legislation that created the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission; toll road merger legislation that consolidated operations of the Garden State Parkway within the New Jersey Turnpike Authority; and highway safety legislation that created the "Safe Corridors" program. He has been outspoken in his concern about the future of New Jersey's transportation financing.

Louis J. Gambaccini

Louis J. Gambaccini is a Distinguished Senior Transportation Fellow and former Executive Director of the Alan M. Voorhees Transportation Center. During his career, Gambaccini was the New Jersey Commissioner of Transportation; the first chairman of NJ TRANSIT Corporation, General Manager of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA), and General Manager of PATH. He is a Fellow with the National Academy of Public Administration, founder and Board Member of the Council for Excellence in Government, and a member of the American Society for Public Administration. In 2003, he served as a member of the Governor's Blue Ribbon Transportation Commission that examined New Jersey's longterm transportation capital program and financing needs.
