Scott Bernstein is President of the Center for Neighborhood and Technology (CNT), which develops resources to promote healthy, sustainable communities. Bernstein is a founding board member of both the Surface Transportation Policy Project and Smart Growth America. He was appointed by President Clinton to the President's Council for Sustainable Development, and served as co-chair of the task forces on State, Local and Regional Initiatives as well as the Metropolitan Strategies Working Group.

In his presentation, Bernstein will examine the effects of September 11 on the efficiency of travel within the U.S. and explore the possibilities for a transportation system that is secure, clean, reliable, and affordable. Specifically, Bernstein will address emerging proposals for an intermodal hub and spoke system and what it will take to realize such a transportation system in an effort to "reconnect our nation."
