NJ Transportation Commissioner Jack Lettiere

Capping a 30-year career at the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), Jack Lettiere became the first career employee to be appointed to serve as the state's transportation commissioner in December 2002. Commissioner Lettiere oversees 16,000 employees and a budget of more than \$3 billion. His duties include chairing the boards of the New Jersey Transit Corporation and the New Jersey Transportation Trust Fund Authority. He also serves on a number of boards including the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, the South Jersey Transportation Authority, the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, and the New Jersey Redevelopment Authority.

Commissioner Lettiere was recently elected vice president of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO), the national work group that is developing the framework for the reauthorization of the federal transportation act. Commissioner Lettiere has instituted numerous innovative financing techniques for complex transportation projects and chairs the nationally recognized Local Bridge Initiative Group.

Prior to becoming Commissioner, Mr. Lettiere served as NJDOT Deputy Commissioner and Assistant Commissioner for Capital Investment. He managed the state's \$2.6 billion transportation capital program.
